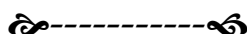

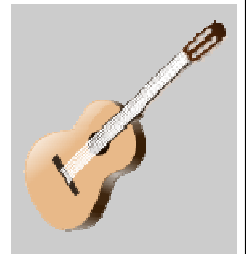


COFFEE HOUSE Saturday, May 10th
